Students who achieve an ONYA this term will be invited to LHPS picture theatre.

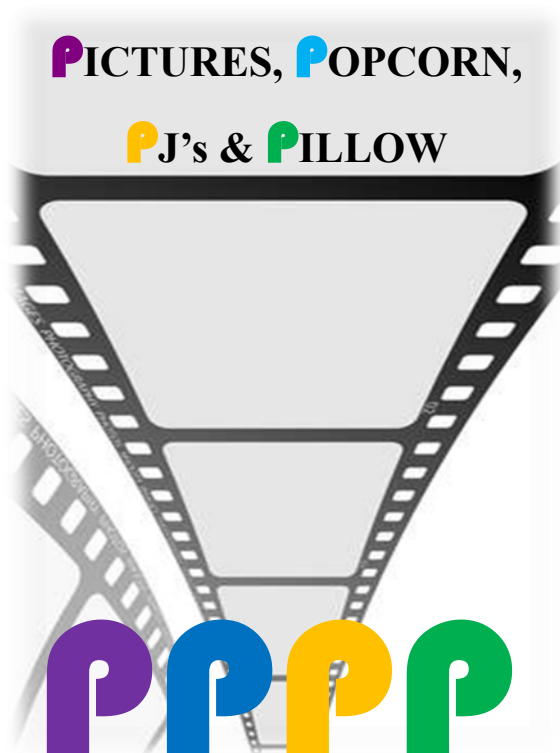
