When I am not on deployment I am posted to Townsville, QLD but my Home town is a place called Yangan in south east QLD (some of you may have heard of it) and that is where all of my family are from, I actually drove though beautiful Lismore in late December to visit friends in Byron Bay prior to leaving for here.
