#### **NAPLAN 2022**

We have now received our school's NAPLAN results for 2022. The attached charts provide an overview of the school's achievements. Given the disruption that our students have faced over the past 3 years, firstly with COVID-19 (which continues to impact student attendance) and then with the two floods, we are very pleased with our students' results. It should be pointed out that schools which are identified as being 'similar schools' are not located in the Lismore area and were not affected by the recent floods.

In summary, Reading in both Year 3 and Year 5 shows our students performing better than similar schools across the state. The same can be said for both Grammar and Numeracy in both year groups. This is a very pleasing outcome, and our students should be congratulated on their excellent Reading, Grammar and Numeracy results. In Year 5 average student outcomes in Spelling were above those of students in similar schools whilst there is room for improvement in Year 3. This was an expected result in Year 3 and matches the school's internal data. A new spelling program was recently introduced at the school to address this.

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Writing outcomes in Year 3 are broadly in line with those of similar schools. We will continue to focus on writing outcomes in Year 5 where students are now using the new writing format, composing their texts using a computer.

Overall, this is a very pleasing set of results, and our students deserve acknowledgment for their efforts and achievements. Well done, Year 3 and Year 5.

#### Debating

Congratulations are extended to our school Debating Team who performed with distinction at the recent Debating Gala Day held at Wyrallah Road Public School. The team won both of their debates. They now await the outcome of the final Gala Day to find out what position they achieved overall, and whether or not they will progress to the next level of the competition.

#### **Zone Athletics Carnival**

Students aged 8+ who qualified went to Byron Bay for the Zone Athletics Carnival. Of these, 4 students placed and will progress to the Regional Athletics Finals.

#### **North Coast Athletics**

Last Friday, several children travelled to Coffs Harbour to compete in the Regional Athletics Carnival. Three super stars emerged, placing in their athletics events. Liam finished third in the 11 years boy's discus, Jacob second in both the 100m and 200m and Ethan third in his 100m and 200m. What a brilliant achievement boys, well done!

#### **Guitar/Keyboard Tuition**

We are working alongside a local professional musician, Glenn Kellett, to provide guitar and keyboard tuition to





students in Years 2-4. Families can use any unused monies in the student's *Flood Grant Fund* to pay for the lessons until the funds are exhausted. Families interested in taking advantage of this wonderful opportunity should complete and return the letter which was sent home recently.

#### Carnivale 14 and 15 September

Our wonderful P&C will be opening the canteen to sell pre-performance hot food, drinks and cakes/slices on both Carnivale evenings. What better way to start the evening! The canteen will close 10 minutes before the performance starts to allow volunteers to take their seats in plenty of time to see the start of the show. #### **Dorroughby Environmental Centre Incursion**
