Student Survey

In Term 2, we are offering our students the opportunity to participate in the NSW Public Schools Student Survey. The survey gives students the chance to share their thoughts and feelings about life at school, including questions about their engagement, learning experiences and wellbeing at school. Hearing directly from our students will help us understand what's working well and where improvements can be made to our school. The survey is confidential, takes around 10 to 15 minutes to complete, and will be conducted online during school hours.

DORROUGHBY INCURSION

In week 4, staff from the Dorroughby Environmental Education Centre came to LHPS to run full day incursions for our infant and primary students, kicking off our Living Things STEM unit. Students were immersed in a wonderland of learning, moving to different stations throughout the day.

Primary students learnt about different insects, their features and their importance in our ecosystems, played threatened species games aimed at identifying causes and solutions for protection, discussed and studied the features of different plants before creating botanical drawings and embarked on a school safari, investigating and recording what insects they could find in the school yard. Infants observed insects and animals in our playground, which we later used in class to create various graphs to help us understand and showcase the living things in our school. They also learned about insects and their features, which inspired them to make salt dough models of ants. Furthermore, to enhance their understanding of creating safe habitats for survival, they crafted bird nests out of natural fibres and clay eggs, now displayed throughout our garden. The incursions were fun and informative, with all students engaged with hands-on learning. A big thank you to the Dorroughby staff for sharing their wealth of knowledge with our budding little scientists.

-Vacation Care service hours are 8am-6pm, pickups after 6pm will incur a late fee of a minimum of \$10 per family.

-On excursion days, please sign children in by 9.00am and complete permission forms. As Vacation Care excursions/incursion costs are based on the number of children booked in, if your child is absent for an excursion/incursion where a cost is involved, you will be invoiced this cost.

Vacation Care is very busy, and bookings MUST be made in advance. As positions are limited and in high demand this is considered a permanent booking for the Vacation period. Absences will incur a full fee if less than 24 hrs is given. More than 24 hrs but less than 7 days = half fee. More than 7 days = no fee. Thank you for choosing NRCS OSHC.



School Attendance and Absences

We recognise that education for your child is important, and regular attendance at school plays an essential role in helping children to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. We also recognise that, on occasions, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences include:

> * being sick or having an infectious disease * having an unavoidable medical appointment * being required to attend a recognised religious holiday * exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral.

We will contact families by text if a student is absent from school. We ask families to notify the school if their child is absent. Parents/carers are required to provide a valid explanation for any absences and provide a medical certificate for absences of 3 or more days. Where an explanation has not been received or where there is not a valid reason for the absence, the school is required to record the absence as unexplained or unauthorised on the student's record.

Attending school on time every day makes a real difference to your child's educational outcomes. Thank you for giving your child the best start in life by ensuring that they attend school regularly and on time.
